WILDERNESS CANOE TRIP - 8-10-40

Thirteen members of Troop 13, Minneapelis Area Council, met at Calvary Baptist Church at 6 A.M. Saturday, August 3, 1940 to go on the Region 10 Wilderness Canoe Trip. We were to ride by truck to base camp at Hibbard's Lodge on Moose Lake. Shortly after we left town, it started to rain and it continued of f and on for some two hours.

The first real stop was at Carleton where we had "brunch". From there we went to Jay Cooke State Park. We spent an hour climbs on the rocks and swimming in the river. The next stop was Duluth where some of the boys swam in Lake Superior and they all ate lunch. Each Scout had brought his lunch with him. Evelth and the iron mims were the next stop and then to Virginia, the queen city of the noth.

We slept "out" at the Virginia Tourist Camp and left early Sunday morning for base camp, getting there about 10 a.m.

Tuesday we laid over and each Scout was able to downat he wanted. Sailing, fishing, berry-picking, paddling, building a raft and other interest occupied the time. Wednesday found us on our way to Kekequabic Lake. By noon we were to where we intended to camp and tentswere up in no time. A sailing trip to the Kek Ranger Tower was scheduled for the P.M.
