Swimming inLouisa Falls "bath tub" was alot of fun. After supper we portaged up the falk and into Lake Louisa. That nite we paddled in the moon-lite. At10'o'clock that nite we made camp at the upper end of the lake. After two nites there we paddled down Louisa against a strong headwind. After portaging again we paddled up Agnes and made camp in the "narrows". Here was one of the best "pike" spots we hit.

Next morning we turned off on the Silence Cut-off"which took us along a small lakes chain with alot of small portages.

That nite we camped on Summer Lake. We caught alot of "Notherns" there (one that-was-ghed-- wasghed1 15 1bs.)

From Summer we came down through North Bay and stayed on the end of it that nite. Therewas a strom that nite and we were glad we had acamp site back in the woods.

The next day we had our sails full of wind the whole way to the base. We Had two long portages that last day from Wind Bay to Wind Lake and from Wind Lake to Moose Lake where the base is located.

Our guides's name was Ed Woolerton andhe was a swell guy.
