

June 5th, 1943.

We left home at 8:10, Saturday morning for the Cance Trip. We ate at Hibbing about 11:30 and left there as soon as we were done eating. We checked in at Winton, and were at the Base about 3:10. We waited around until Hod came and then we ate. After supper I went fishing.

June 6th, 1943.

We left the Base about 9:00. The first lake we went through was Moose Lake, and then into Newfound Lake. After that we hit Sucker Lake and then Prarie Portage.

After that we went into Baley Bay, which is in Basswood, and then to the Ranger Cabin. Then we pertaged to Burke Lake. Then we pertaged into Sunday Lake and then into Meadows and then pertaged to Lake Agnes. From their we camped at Louisa Falls and we cought some fish for supper.

June 7, 1943.

We left camp from Louisa Falls about 10:00. We divided up and went one way and three went up to an island where we were going to camp on Agnes Lake. That day we saw some snow up on the rocks. We ate supper then some went fishing.

June 8th, 1943.

Today we didn't break camp because we stayed on the same island. Three boys stayed at camp and four cances went back for the painted rocks, but didn't find them. We went into a lake with no name. When we cam back it was realy windy. We ate supper and then sat around and talked.

June 9th, 1943.

We broke camp around ten oclock and we started into Silence Lake, but first we had to portage then we went into Summer Lake and from their into Noon Lake. We sat dawn and rested for awhile and some of us went swimming. We also saw two deer. Then we went into Shade Lake and that was a terrible wind. Then we came to North Bay, where we camped that night.

June 10th, 1943.

We broke camp this morning about the same time as yesterday morning. That day we paddled hard for about an hour and then we had dinner on an Island. After we were done eating some of us went over where their had been a logging camp. The rest went to the Ranger's Cabin and waited for us. When we got their we saw a Canadian plane. Then we went into Wind Bay and portaged across to Wind Lake and camped their for the night.

June 11th, 1943.

They started out about 10:00 o'clock this morning. We paddled across Windy Lake and then we had to portage into Moose Lake. This portage was a hard one. We paddled a little while longer and we were into the Base.

We ate dinner and started on the way home. We got home at 8:00 o'clock.
