Our plans had to be remodeled several times but at last on June 20 we were on our way to the Canoe Trails Base. Twelve Scouts and three Scouters rode together on a bus. This was conduct veindow group singing as well as to the asking of many questions and much speculation as to how the trip would be made.

On reaching the Base Camp we were met by John Stupes the one of the Guides. He helped us get tents set up for the night. After preparing our supper and getting settled we met the Director Mr. Hod Ludlow who had been absent on our arrival.

Bright and early Monday morning we got under way in spite of the unsettled weather. Our party had been divided as it was too large for the campsites. Some went on the shorter route in order to have core time to fish, while a number of us wanted to cover as much distance as possible. We went swimming tonight and some of the fellows declared that a thin film of ice formed all over their bodies as they went into the water.

The loons and beaver proved interesting. Some of the boys saw a moose. Bear tracks were observed and no one suggested taking a tracking test at that time.

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
