## MY TRIP TO SOMMERS CANOE BASE

My companion and I left Minneapolis Saturday morning, August 1, 1942, by Greyhound bus for Ely, Minnesota, where we were met by the Scout Director and taken to the lodge on Moose Lake.

It was dark when we reached camp, so that my first impression was left for the morning. We slept in the lodge Saturday, and the next day helped the

guides pack for our trip.

It rained that night, and again the next day as we traveled south on Lake Agnes to Louisa Falls. We arrived there about noon, had lunch, and decided to camp there a day. That night a bear visited our camp, but the guide succeeded in hustling him along the way. We rigged up a sail for one of the canoes and sailed the ake, and some of the others fished, without luck. We also took baths in Natural Tub at Louisa Falls.

Early Friday morning we started out again, we had two tough portages in a row, where we had to reday our packs. We lunched off Bayley Bay on Sunday Lake, where Swede caught a five mund bass and a Northern. One of the other Scouts also caught a small Northern. We crossed the Bay, visited the Trading Post at Prairie Portage, and saw a Ranger's plane from Ely. We traveled on Sucker Lake to Newfound, and while enroute met another party of Scouts. We camped on an island. It was very windy so were not bothered by moscuitoes that had been with us constantly up to this point. We were treated with pie for supper - also had four fish given us by a friendly fisherman.

Saturday we cleaned up camp and set out for the base, which we reached about 1 o'clock. It was just in time to catch our bus out of Ely for Minneapolis, which we reached about 1 A.M.

We had a splended trip and are planning on returning next year.
