1942

Aug 7,

Left Minot N. Dak at 6:45 P.M.

our party who had left Minot on
the 6th of Aug.

the Catholic Church in Bemidji with
a friend

During the day we traveled towards
Ely, visiting Hibbing Minn. and other
interesting places.

office and then proceeded to the hotel
where we checked in.

During the night we slept outside
the Cabin.

Aug 9,

In the morning we were
given our equipment. Then we
went to launch our canoes our
trip was at last started
and our guide was Rod Sullivan

aug 9

The director of Camp and our
swampst was "Bill Webster".

Leaving "moose Lake" we went to
Newfound Lake to Prairie Portage.
where we ate Dinner. from there
we went into Bayley Bay and
~~then portaged into on down~~

after stopping at the Ranger's Cabin.
from there we portaged into Sunday
Lake and the meadows. and then
on into Agnes where we camped
near Louisa Falls.

aug 10,

Today we went up above the
falls and went fishing in Louisa

Like here we ate dinner and the way back to the falls we tried some spruce gum, 'Beany alson' bit into a piece so hard one of his gold teeth broke loose.

Aug 11

Today it rained so we stayed at Louisa again and just sat around

Aug 12

The morning we had flap jacks and were the even good.

We began to paddle down the river but the waves were so high we camped for supper on an island after supper the wind died down so we paddled until about 11 P.M. were were camped at it was a trading post near Washington D.C.

Here we bought some Hudson
Bay blankets and shirts.

Aug 13
We paddled into Wind Bay
than portaged over to Wind Lake
than to Moose there we had supper
after supper we crossed over to
the Base Camp and slept for
the night

Aug 14.

We checked out from the Customs
and went to Duluth where we
slept during the night and then
started back to Wind
